### NOTIFICATION OF KAHUTARA, OARO. AND TUTAEPUTAPUTA MĀTAITAI RESERVES AND TÄNGATA TIAKI/KAITIAKI

Pursuant to Regulation 22 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999, the Director-General of the Ministry for Primary Industries gives the following notice.

Pursuant to regulation 20 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999, by notice in the New Zealand Gazette published on 12 September 2018, the Minister of Fisheries declared the Kahulera, Oaro, and Tütaeputaputa Mātaitai Reserves. The Kahutara and Tüleeputaputa Mātaitai Reserves are over the lower parts of the Kahutara and Conway Rivers, Kaikoura, respectively. The Oaro Mataltai Reserve is over the fisheries waters defined by Schedule 4 of the Kaikõura (Te Tai o Marokura) Marine Management Act 2014 as the Oaro Mātaitai, plus the lower reaches of the Oaro River.

The full description of the boundaries of the Mataital Reserves are included in the Fisheries (Declaration of Kahutara Mātaitai Reserve) Notice 2018; the Fisheries (Declaration of Totaeputaputa Mataitai Reserve) Notice 2018; and the Fisheries (Declaration of Oaro Mataitai Reserve) Notice 2018.

Pursuant to regulation 21 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999, in an instrument dated 18 August 2018, the Minister of Fisheries appointed Maria Andrea Clayton, Brett Cowan, Nukuroa Tirikatene-Nash, Sir Mark Solomon, Gina Solomon, Keepa Te Rangihiwinui Timms (Major), Debble Walford, Jeff Reardon, and Taukiri Manawatu as Tangata Tieki/Kaitiaki for all three Matellai Reserves. The appointments are for a term of

The Mataltal Reserves and appointment of Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki take effect from Wednesday, 10 October 2018.

A mataitai reserve is an identified traditional fishing ground managed by the tangata whenua through Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki.

The Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki may authorise any individual to take fish, aquatic file or seaweed for customary food gathering purposes from within the whole or any part of the mataitai reserve. No fishing for customary food gathering purposes may take place in the mataltai reserve without authorisation from the Tangeta Tiaki/ Kaitiaki.

Commercial fishing within a mataital reserve is prohibited under regulation 24(2) of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999.
